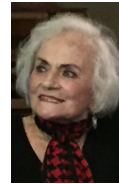


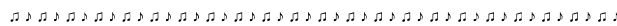

Knowing her certainly brightened my thoughts and provided all the excuse I needed to send her a little something to give thanks for the sincerity she shared.
